

The Department of Pesticide Regulation (DPR) is recruiting a Dermal Toxicologist to conduct complex evaluations and interpretations of data for the purpose of identifying and advising on potential adverse health effects associated with the use of pesticides. The incumbent will act as the subject matter expert for dermal toxicity and will be involved in the review of alternative (in vitro, in silico, in chemico) approaches for identifying potential skin sensitization hazards. The incumbent will also work as directed with the US EPA, Health Canada, OECD and others on standardized approaches to the review and acceptance of new in vitro data based on alternative approaches for skin sensitization and irritation. As the subject matter expert in dermal toxicity and dermal toxicokinetics, the incumbent shall analyze data used in exposure analysis to evaluate dermal absorption data (triple pack) and assist with updating approaches for estimating internal doses from dermal absorption. The incumbent will also be working in the development and application of mathematical models that define the role of toxicokinetics and dynamics in estimating exposure.

Hiring by the State of California is a two-step process that first involves completing a qualification assessment and then applying for vacant positions.
