Dear Representative Trahan,

The undersigned addiction, mental health, and health care professional organizations in the Coalition to Stop Opioid Overdose (CSOO) write to endorse your House Resolution 349, which would support the goals of Overdose Awareness Day by lowering the United States flag to half-staff on all Federal buildings on August 31st of each year. According to data recently released by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the country's overdose crisis remains unabated. It's now estimated that there were over 93,000 deaths due to a drug overdose in the U.S. last year — representing an increase of almost 30% compared to 2019. Unfortunately, the COVID-19 pandemic seems to have only exacerbated this horrific loss of life. It is time for the federal government to recognize this tragedy by flying flags at half-staff.

While many Americans across this country have worked tirelessly to improve access to prevention, treatment, harm reduction, and recovery support services to help those struggling with substance use disorder (SUD), people with SUD are still often stigmatized, discriminated against, and marginalized. Thus, not only would lowering flags to half-staff help honor those we have already lost to addiction and overdose, but it would serve as a national reminder that all Americans living with SUD deserve our compassion and respect.

Thank you for your leadership and for your ongoing commitment to ensuring Americans with SUD can access the care they need. We stand ready to work with you on this important initiative.
