

What is Medical Toxicology?

Medical Toxicology is a sub-specialty of medicine with a focus on the prevention, evaluation, treatment, and monitoring of injury and illness from exposure to drugs and chemicals, as well as biological and radiological agents.

What do Medical Toxicologists do?

Medical toxicologists work in clinical, academic, governmental and public health settings, and provide poison control center leadership.

Medical Toxicology Areas of Expertise

Important areas of medical toxicology include acute drug poisoning; adverse drug events; substance use disorders, addiction and withdrawal; chemicals and radiologic materials; terrorism preparedness; venomous bites and stings; and environmental and workplace exposures.

Data collection includes pediatric marijuana and opioid exposures, envenomations, plant and mushroom poisoning, fentanyl analog, and novel opioid and stimulant exposures.
