Effective September 30, 1999, the American College of Medical Toxicology has entered into a 5 year cooperative agreement with the U.S. Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry (ATSDR), a division of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. The maturation of the Internet, with its convenience and now quite widespread use, has opened up new possibilities for scientific publication. Many existing print journals now publish Internet versions. These are generally on-line copies of the hard-copy journal whose primary purpose is to provide greater convenience of access. The on-line format can also be used to publish supplementary information that may be too lengthy to include in the more expensive hard-copy format. Other journals have been started which have no hard-copy counterpart. Here the advantage of the internet is lower cost and greater speed of publication.

At the other end of the spectrum, the Internet is widely used for discussion groups which range from listserve to moderated formats (such as ACMTnet). Discussion groups take advantage of the ease and speed of communication offered by the Internet to allow the rapid exchange of ideas and information in a minimally structured setting.
