Call for Proposals: ACMT Practice Symposium

Deadline: January 23, 2026

ACMT is now accepting proposals for the **Practice Symposium at 2026 North American Congress of Clinical Toxicology (NACCT)**. This 60-minute session focuses on topics related to clinical practice development, career advancement, and expanding the scope of medical toxicology. Didactic presentation is preferred, but panel discussions may be considered if appropriate for the topic. In this session, attendees will learn about cutting edge topics in medical toxicology practice.

Previous Practice Symposium topics have included:

- Developing an ECMO Protocol Policy (2020)
- Updates in Drug Impaired Driving (2021)
- Harm Reduction in Toxicology Practice (2022)
- A Toxicologist, a Neurologist, and a Psychiatrist Walk Into the ICU... (2023)
- Non-Fatal Overdose Bioskveillance: Building a New Overdose Surveillance Infrastructure (2024)
- The Great THC Debate: Emerging Cannabinoids, Controversies, and Evolving Regulations (2025)

How to Apply

Proposals should include the following:

- **Title:** Reflecting the overall theme and vision for the symposium.
- **Objectives:** 1-3 learning objectives that succinctly highlight what educational benefits attendees will gain. Resource for developing meaningful learning objectives:

- **Lecture Description:** 3-5 sentence description of the lecture, explaining why the topic is compelling and valuable to attendees.
- **Speaker(s):** You may propose a potential speaker or panelists, but please do not make any commitments prior to submitting your proposal. Final selection of speakers and modifications to the session are at the discretion of the ACMT Education Committee.

While some adjustments may be necessary, the Education Committee reserves the right to reconsider a session if there are significant changes, such as speaker substitutions or shifts in the session's intended focus.

Review Process

All submissions will be peer-reviewed by the ACMT Education Committee and leadership. Selected proposals will be forwarded to NACCT for final approval, with decisions anticipated by February 2026.

Travel Support

ACMT members are responsible for covering their own expenses to attend NACCT, including travel, hotel, and registration fees.
